PLG 100: Introduction to Political Organizing

Required for Certificate

Politics matters! As state employees, everything we do is about politics because we have the unique opportunity to elect our boss—the governor of California. This course examines the importance of political organizing and what it entails; methods of winning an election; and how we—as state employees—are directly affected by politics and why we should be involved.

PLG 110: Effective Lobby Visits

Required for Certificate

As state workers, it's important to communicate our message effectively to our legislators. One way to do that is to go to their Capitol and district offices for a 'lobby visit.' This course will teach you the nuts and bolts of lobby visits, from setting up a meeting to messaging. It will also examine how a bill becomes a law, and the dos and don'ts of lobby visits from the perspective of the steward.

PLG 120: Organizing at the Worksite
